The main gate to the site is closed and a safety notice placed on it. Notice of the site closure is placed on social media platforms. Snow and Ice If the snow fall starts to stick on the main access track to the centre, site to be closed and visitors, school groups and staff to leave immediately. If there is a forecast of amber warning for snow, the site is to close for the affected period.
