## Officer's Appraisal

### Initial description of proposed

- a) 2 x Sycamore at 12m 30 % reduction to 2.5m.
- b) 2 x Ash at 12m 30% reduction to 8.5m.
- c) 1 x Sycamore at 13m 30% reduction to 9m.
- d) 1 x Ash at 15m 30% reduction to 9m

During the consideration of the application and a site visit it was agreed that the works be amended as follows:-

- 201 Sycamore reduce canopy 3m from 12m to 9m.
- 202 Sycamore reduce canopy 3m from 12m to 9m.
- 203 Sycamore reduce canopy 3m from 12m to 9m.
- 204 Sycamore reduce canopy 3m from 12m to 9m.
- 205 Ash reduce canopy 3m from 12m to 9m.
- 206 Ash reduce canopy 3m from 12m to 9m.
- 208 Sycamore reduce canopy 3m from 12m to 9m.

## Appraisal

### Clarification of Works

The consultation process identified discrepancies on the proposed works and the trees on site; specifically, the species of some of the trees and the precise

Pembrokeshire Coast National Park Authority Development Management Committee 2 September 2020 locations of the trees in question. The PCNPA site manager visited the site and tagged the trees and plotted the locations and species for consideration as part of the application. This information was sent to the agent for clarification and was agreed via an email sent Wednesday 5<sup>th</sup> August 2020 and was agreed by all parties.

### <u>Ownership</u>

Trees 201-203 inclusive and 208 are located on PCNPA managed/owned land and the site manager has provided permission for the works via an email sent on Friday 7<sup>th</sup> August 2020.

Trees 204-206 are under private ownership. An advisory note clarifying that permission is required from all relevant landowners will be included in the TPO decision.

#### Additional considerations

The PCNPA site manager has asked that a bat survey is carried out prior to any works on PCNPA land. This will be included as an advisory note to any TPO decision.

#### Conclusion

The proposed works are to reduce the exposure of the trees through a reduction in height, which will retain the features and alleviate the exposure to reduce the trees in question to a similar height of the adjacent woodland canopy. The proposed works are considered to follow good arboriculture management.

### Recommendation

- APPROVE, subject to the following conditions:
- 1. 1. All works hereby approved shall be carried out within two years of the date of this consent.


**Reason:** Required to be imposed pursuant to Section 91 (1) of the Town and Country Planning Act 1990 (as amended).

2. The works shall be carried out in accordance with the Approved tree location plan

**Reason**: To prevent detrimental impact to trees, hedges and other landscape features which contribute to the amenity, landscape & biodiversity of the site and surrounding area. Policy: Local Development Plan - Policies: 1 (National Park Purposes and Duty), 8 (Special Qualities), 11 (Protection of Biodiversity), 15 (Conservation of the Pembrokeshire Coast National Park), and 30 (Amenity)

#### Advice note:

• Site manager requests that a bat survey be undertaken prior to any work. No bat roosts are to be disturbed and work on the trees is prohibited if bats are found.
