REPORT OF THE PERFORMANCE AND COMPLIANCE CO-ORDINATOR

SUBJECT: PERFORMANCE REPORT FOR THE PERIOD ENDING 31 OCTOBER 2017

Introduction

The performance report follows the structure of the Corporate and Resources Plan for 2017/18. This follows the approach of the Well-being of Future Generations Act with seven well-being objectives, with an additional section providing general governance information.

The following report presents the performance to date up to 31st October 201/18 and includes Q1 and Q2 data (April – September) for some data sets.

Planning

The LDP preparation remains 2 months behind the dates specified in the original Delivery Agreement. However the intention is still to regain those 2 months 'lost' so we are back on track in the run up to placing the Plan on Deposit.

The % of all planning applications determined within time periods required ytd is above target at 82.58. However, the average time taken to determine all planning applicants in days ytd is above the <67 target. This is due to a number of major applications and applications subject to legal agreements that have been determined which has had an impact on the overall average number of days. One application for costs at section 78 appeal was upheld in the reporting period, which has been reported at the Development Management Committee meeting

In terms of the new online document management facility a meeting with the supplier was arranged to discuss new timetable for implementation as the supplier is making alterations to the system.

Website Hits and Web Walk Downloads

The yearly target for the Enjoy website has been amended from 26000 to 15000 to benchmark against last year. This is a move to monitoring retention of hits rather than growth. Organic promotion is to continue with ongoing monitoring of impact. As part of new website development it is being considered whether some content can be migrated across.

Please note that there has been an issue with Google Analytics. This has meant that there was a period in October where hits to the Main website were not captured and this will have affected the overall statistics for October. This issue has now been

addressed. Data for October for web walk downloads is not available. The IT department have fixed this issue to enable us to continue to collect web walk download data.

Centres

YTD there has been a 1.3% decrease in visitors compared to last year. The number of visitors in Q2 (July-September) was 5.5% less than 2016/17 across sites. 112256 visitors in Q2 of 2017/18 compared to 118799 visitors in Q2 2016/17.

There has been a 4.4% increase in merchandise income ytd for centres compared to October 2016/17 and a 22.7% increase in admissions income ytd at Carew and Castell Henllys compared to 2016/17.

Volunteering and Social Inclusion

There has been a decrease in the number of people engaged with through social inclusion activities compared to last year. However a new report and recording method is being piloted with all data now coming from the Events and Activities Database and this may have impacted on the figure.

There has been a 12% increase on volunteer days ytd compared to 2016/17.

It is expected that the Pathway project which is now underway will have a positive impact on both volunteering and social inclusion numbers. Please note a Volunteering Co-ordinator has now been appointed.

Members Training

There was a query at the last Operational Review Committee about whether training targeted at new Members could have impacted on the figure. The calculation is based on places made available. For those training sessions targeted at new members the number of available places reflects the number of new Members and not the total number of Members.

Welsh Language

A complaint was made to the Welsh Language Commissioner in Quarter 1. The Authority has provided evidence to Welsh Language Commissioner and a draft response has now been received. It related to English only letter being sent. Internal processes have been amended.





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Rangers Case Study – Working with landowners:

320 participants completed the The Preseli Beast and Beast Bach fell running races at the start of May. The 24 mile route starts and finishes in Maenclochog and passes over the Preseli Hills, into the Gwaun over Carningli to Newport and back. The National Park negotiated with 3 landowners to create temporary gaps to the side of 3 stiles on a footpath within the first mile of the course. The race continues to be a wonderful success and a real community event.

Stock proof fencing is an essential part of any conservation grazing scheme and at Llanferran Farm, volunteers are about to complete over a kilometre of replacement sheep net fence. This will allow ponies to graze Penbwchdy headland coastal heathland rather than breaking into grassland adjoining.

So far it has taken well over 100 volunteer days with VW's FONP and Princes Trust groups all contributing.

Rangers Case Study – Ysgol Bro Ingli and 'Bee Friendly Town:




