#### Officer's Appraisal

#### **Site and Context**

Cilrhedyn serves as a depot for both the Warden and Ranger Team, as well as housing a workshop and was originally opened in 1995 as a woodland centre and sawmill but sales to public ceased in 2017. The creation of a new path down the side of one of the barns has lead to the need for a lighting scheme to ensure health and safety of staff and volunteers.

# **Description of Proposal**

The application proposes 8 low level LED lights on the south eastern side of the drying shed at a height of 0.650 metres above ground level. The lights are detailed as being 3x watt LED bulbs with an output of 240 lumens.

Due to the numbers of volunteers and public accessing the buildings, the lights are proposed to improve health and safety along the newly formed path.

The application raises the following planning matters:

- Siting, Design and Impact upon the Special Qualities of the National Park
- Biodiversity

# Siting, Design and Impact upon the Special Qualities of the National Park

The siting and location of the proposed lighting has been carefully designed to ensure that it is low level and will not be visible from outside of the site. A low hedge bank runs along the barn and the lighting will be just above this, but directed downwards. Due to the positioning of adjacent farm buildings to the south east, it is not expected that the lights will be visible from the B4313.

# Biodiversity:

Policy 11 of the Local Development Plan requires that any development which may disturb or harm protected species will only be allowed where the effects will be acceptable minimised or mitigated through careful design, work scheduling or other measures.

The PCNPA Ecologist has been consulted with the proposals and had no objection. The application is therefore considered to comply with Policy 11 of the Local Development Plan.


#### Conclusion

The proposed lighting scheme is considered to be reasonable and to comply with all relevant LDP policies and is therefore recommended for approval subject to appropriate conditions.

#### Recommendation

APPROVE, subject to the following conditions:

- The development shall begin not later than five years from the date of this decision. Reason: Required to be imposed pursuant to Section 91 (1) of the Town and Country Planning Act 1990 (as amended).

The development shall be carried out in accordance with the following approved plans and documents: Site Location Plan 1:1250 received 5th November 2019 Block Plan 1:200 received 5th November 2019 Side Elevation received 17th December 2019 Light specification received 3rd January 2020 Reason: In order to be clear on the approved scheme of development in the interests of protecting visual amenity and the special qualities of the National Park. New External Lighting to Timber Drying Shed






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Position of Lights 650mm above ground level
